

BEBINGTON CEMETERY COMMONWEALTH WAR GRAVES

There are 149 Commonwealth War Graves within the cemetery, 92 First World War casualties and 57 Second World War casualties

The casualties are commemorated in three ways within the cemetery



CWGC Headstones

On individual graves casualties are commemorated with Commonwealth war grave headstones.



Private Memorials

The casualty is commemorated on the families own memorial and the CWGC ensures the casualty's name is legible. When the name can no longer be read a CWGC headstone is put up close to the private memorial.

Screen Walls

When it is not possible to place a memorial on the grave casualties are commemorated on a screen wall, there are two screen walls in Bebington Cemetery.



Casualties who were cremated are also commemorated on these walls.

Cross of Sacrifice

The CWGC built the Cross of Sacrifice for people to join together to remember the people lost in the war

The screen walls, cross of sacrifice and war grave headstones are all still maintained by the commission.
